God: Yes. Let it be like this.


Me: So...I'm not broken?

"The Church is the only cooperative society that exists for the benefit of its non-members." William Temple

William Temple was the leader of the Church of England during World War II. He tried to communicate the call of the Church of Jesus Christ at such a tumultuous time. His thoughts above recall the passion and mission of the early church. The church was created to be a new humanity that proclaims the power of Jesus through everything they did. They were preaching and proclaiming the Peace of Christ in the Gospel of Jesus.

As we continue to live out the Mission Jesus gave us, we must have our eyes to see the Gospel of Jesus change lives. In the history of the church, The Holy Spirit moved us from the prayer meeting into the crowds, He took us from behind lock doors to the center of the Temple, He transformed us from weak to powerful, from fearful to courageous. For the early church, they believed it was their calling to make sure everyone heard the Good News. The message spread, forming communities around the world who then sought make sure everyone around them believed the Gospel. We have the same message and same calling.

We at Lycoming Centre are a product of Christians in 1847 who wanted to start a church so more people could hear, understand, and believe the Gospel. We sent out members to start Bethel Presbyterian later on so that more people could hear, understand, and believe in Jesus. We have stories in our collective memory of people's lives being changed, some our close friends and family members. The Church is to always be a church on the move- taking part in Christ's mission. On Sundays, we gather for worship, and we scatter to our daily frontlines where God has called us to be His witnesses in our work, neighborhoods, and networks. In these places, we are not there by coincidence, we are there by divine appointment.

As a Christian we hold our lives to a high standard of the Biblical ethic of the Ten Commandments, and also have the compassion of someone who is a sinner saved by grace. When the Christian lives consistently with Christian ethic and proclaims Christ's message of grace, people's lives are blessed and transformed. This is always the pattern and it is always where the Spirit loves to work. It really is that simple, but it definitely is not easy. Understanding and living out of the Gospel of Jesus is the heavy lifting of the Christian life, and the Spirit works quietly and consistently in our lives to make us into these types of missionaries.

I pray that Lycoming Centre grows in our mission as a Church to seek to be transformed by the Holy Spirit so that we may participate in the Holy Spirit transforming others. In other words, making disciples who then make disciples with a heart for Greater Williamsport.

Child Evangelism Fellowship

The students took our VBS to Randall Circle where we ministered to the children who live there. Around 40 different children attended VBS during the week. Four kids responded to the gospel message and received Jesus as their Savior!

Sojourner Truth Ministries

The students provided some landscaping, clean up, painting and minor repairs at Sojourner's facilities. We also prepared and served meals in the soup kitchen. On Saturday, the youth band lead worship and one of the students shared the Bible message.



Hello everyone!

We would like to introduce you to the AED (Automated External Defibrillator) that is located in our church lounge, adjacent to the kitchen! The purpose of the device is to assess the heart rhythm in people experiencing cardiac arrest and the need for a shock in an unconscious victim should an emergency situation arise.



If you witness an emergency:

- ▼ If available, designate someone close by to call 911. If someone is not available, call 911 yourself. The instructions for calling them are on the front of the AED cabinet.
- Designate someone to bring the AED to the victim's location.
- Be available for any other instructions that those caring for the victim may ask you to perform after 911 arrives.

QR Codes

You will be starting to see QR codes in the bulletin and in other areas as Lycoming Centre works to keep up with technology! If you are not familiar with them, here is a brief explanation of what a QR code is and how it works. QR stands for "Quick Response." While they may look simple, QR codes are capable of storing lots of data. But no matter how much they contain, when scanned, the QR code should allow the user to access information instantly —

hence why it's called a Quick Response code. A QR code is a type of barcode that can be read easily by a digital device and which stores information as a series of pixels in a square-shaped grid. Because many smartphones have built-in QR readers – they are used in marketing and advertising campaigns or in our case, to easily share information about church events and to make signing up for events much easier.

Scanning a QR code using your device is straightforward:

- 1. Open or the camera on your smartphone or iPad. Older phones may require downloading a QR reader application.
- 2. Point it at the QR code you should be able to point your camera from any angle and still receive the necessary information.
- 3. The data will be instantly shown on screen for instance, if the QR code contains contact details, your phone should instantly download these.
